

ABOUT THE EXAM

The Annual Certification Exam of BCP-I will be conducted online. Candidates may appear for the exam from anywhere using their own laptops, PCs or smart phones. You will need a good internet connection. It is up to the candidates to appear for the exam from a location where they can get uninterrupted power supply and good Wi-Fi / internet connection.

You do not have to download any app. An "Exam Module" will be activated on the day of exam on BCP-I website. Each candidate will be provided with a login id and password.

There will be two papers:

- 1) Basic Sciences
- 2) Applied Perfusion Technology

Each paper will consist of 45 questions with 45 minutes per paper.

All the questions will be of MCQ type with 2 marks each. There will be no negative marking.

Answers once selected cannot be changed.

You have the option of skipping any question(s). When you answer the last question, the skipped question(s) will reappear in the same sequence, provided there is time.

There will be a timer which will start the countdown from 45 minutes once you access the question paper. If you have finished answering all questions in the first paper, you may "submit" the paper and go onto the second one.

At the end of 45 minutes the answer will be "Auto" submitted.

Once you submit paper 1 you will be able to access paper 2. Again the timer will start countdown from 45 minutes.

The passing level is 50%. You have to pass in both papers. Marks from one paper will not be carried forward to the other paper.

There will be a mock test around a week before the actual exam date. This will enable the candidates to familiarize themselves with the whole process of appearing for an online exam. It will also help you to avoid any technical issues during the actual exam. The mock test is only a drill and it does not carry any weight age as far as the actual exam is concerned.

The initial certificate is valid for a period of five years. Re-certification is based on providing proof of being active in Perfusion, as per the rules and regulations of BCP-I in force at that time.
